Strategy of the Month

Give Your Students Choice!

Creative assignments encourage students to become more engaged and motivate them to generate and communicate ideas. Solving interesting and complex problems also pique their individual curiosities. Students are naturally more inclined to push themselves and each other when solving problems they care about. Students may be a little apprehensive about creative assignments especially if they have had few opportunities to make choices about their learning paths. Creative assignments help students focus and develop their strengths and interests while giving them some space to think critically about course topics (Faculty Focus, 2013).

Steps for giving students choice through a personal preference project assignment are:

- 1. Students decide the format (paper, podcast, video, website, etc.) and topic of their project
- 2. Students submit their topic of choice for approval during the second week of class
- 3. The content of the project reflects the course learning outcomes and/or professionally specified standards
- 4. Project evaluation and presentation rubrics are included in your syllabus materials
- 5. Projects are completed and presented at the end of the semester

Tip - Provide incremental deadlines to help students successfully complete the project!
