STRATEGY

Use Pressbooks to distribute your course materials.

Pressbooks is an open-source platform used to create digital textbooks and educational materials. Because Pressbooks can be used to develop and distribute customizable digital content, it reduces the expenses associated with traditional publishing, printing, and distribution. Using Pressbooks can also help you to leverage open educational resources (OER) to provide students with freely accessible materials that can be easily adapted to meet your specific course needs.

Pressbooks is available to UF faculty, staff, and students at no cost. You can create an account or view the catalog on the [University of Florida Pressbooks website](#).

AI Tip of the Month from CITT

Students, faculty, and staff can now access Microsoft Copilot using their UF accounts at copilot.microsoft.com! After visiting the Copilot website, click on “Login” in the top-right corner to sign in. Once signed in, your chats are protected under UF’s data agreement with Microsoft, meaning that your conversations are not saved and are not used for data mining or training purposes. Copilot is powered by OpenAI’s language models, and the protected, signed-in version should be the first tool you consider when looking for a chatbot for university business.
