

Enhancing CV Writing through Al-guided Interviews

BACKGROUND/INTRODUCTION

- An Al-guided interview can prompt students to reflect on their patient interactions and professional conduct on their CIPPE^{1,2}
- It can also assist in generating concise, but meaningful statements for their CV

Background and Purpose:

Often, after rotations, distinct experiences may blend together in your memory and details may be lost. Dedicating time for focused self-reflection is essential to distinguish and recall those experiences that best illustrate your skills and qualities. In this assignment you will create a detailed self-evaluation that captures specific instances sharing your active participation and impact on patient care. This exercise will not only aid in your self-awareness but also serve as a valuable resource when preparing your CV or for interviews for internships, residencies, or jobs, where you may encounter situational interview questions.

Objectives/Goals of the Activity

- 1. Develop the ability to self-reflect, discerning personal and professional experiences that showcase their progression for a pharmacy career.
- Identify and articulate impactful patient care experiences during a clinical rotation.
 Recognize and communicate professional strengths and areas for improvement in future
- experiential settings.

Course-Level Objective(s): Demonstrate self-awareness in reflecting on personal development needs and then establishing goals for continuing professional development.

- 2nd year PharmD students were provided an instructional video and example conversation
- The interview concluded with a prompt to generate bullet points for the CIPPE section of their CV

Initial Prompt: I'm preparing to submit a final self-evaluation for a pharmacy school, direct patient care introductory experiential rotation in community pharmacy. I want to make sure my self-reflection includes lots of memorable, concrete details and examples. You will play the role of a detail-oriented interviewer. Please interview me about my rotation experience, how I brought professionalism into my practice, my personal strengths on rotation, and areas for future improvement. In addition, provide feedback on how I can improve based on the examples I give. Ask questions one at a time. Use follow-up questions to help draw out more concrete details and examples from me. Limit to a maximum of two to three follow-up questions per topic.

Final Prompt: Can you provide 3 bullet points on my rotation experience to put on my curriculum vitae? Limit the length of each bullet point to 200 characters.

• In the in-person CV workshop, faculty discussed general guidance and gave students time to update their CV (post-class assignment).

The purpose of this educational innovation was to engage more students to accurately update their curriculum vitae (CV) to reflect their community introductory pharmacy practice experience (CIPPE).

METHODS

- Updated CV submissions were evaluated for a section on their CIPPE and bullet points and/or a description of the CIPPE experience
 - 2024 CV submissions were compared to the 2023 cohort using Chi-squared tests
 - 2024 CVs were reviewed for incorporation of AI interview generated content
- Optional survey prior to and after completing the assignment
 - Rated AI experience on a 4-5-point Likert scale
- Comments from surveys were evaluated for themes

RESULTS

RESULTS, continued

- All students completed the pre-activity survey
- 47% of students had "explored AI and used it a couple of times"
- 147 responses in post-activity survey

Post-activity Survey Statements	Neutral	Likely	Extremely Likely
Likelihood to use generative AI for personal and professional use*	21.1%	38.8%	23.8%
Likelihood to use generative Al as an interview tool*	25.2%	34.7%	23.1%
Likelihood to use generative AI to add to your CV*	25.2%	34%	23.8%

*Percentages were <10% for unlikely and extremely unlike

DISCUSSION/FUTURE DIRECTIONS

- Facilitates self-reflection for a large cohort on their own time
- Faculty plans to incorporate framework to create optimal CV bullet points/description

CONCLUSION

- Al-guided approach gave students the opportunity to focus on self-discovery
- Led to more students providing detailed updates on their CV
- Most students stated AI was a helpful tool that they would use in the future
